

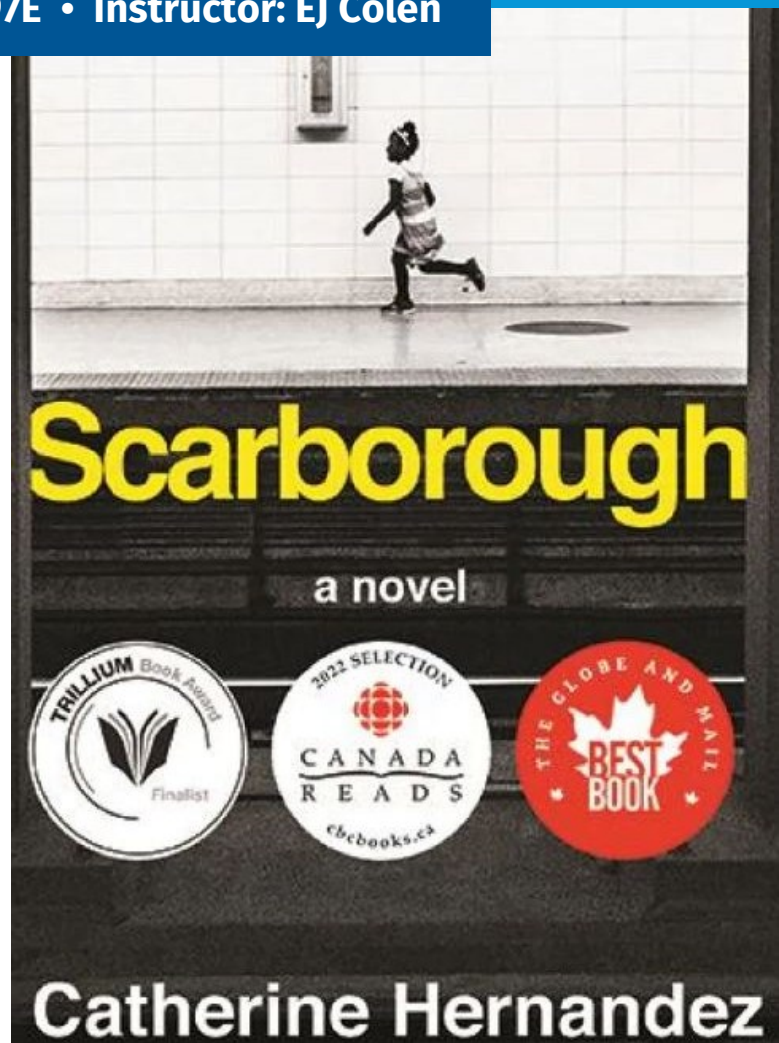
Western Reads Canada
