

# Confronting Settler Colonialism in Canadian History

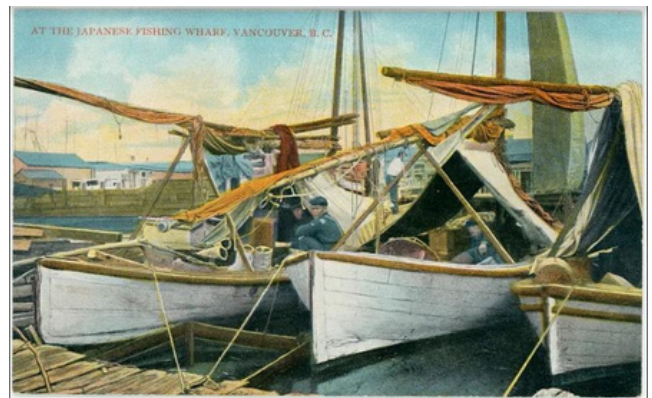
