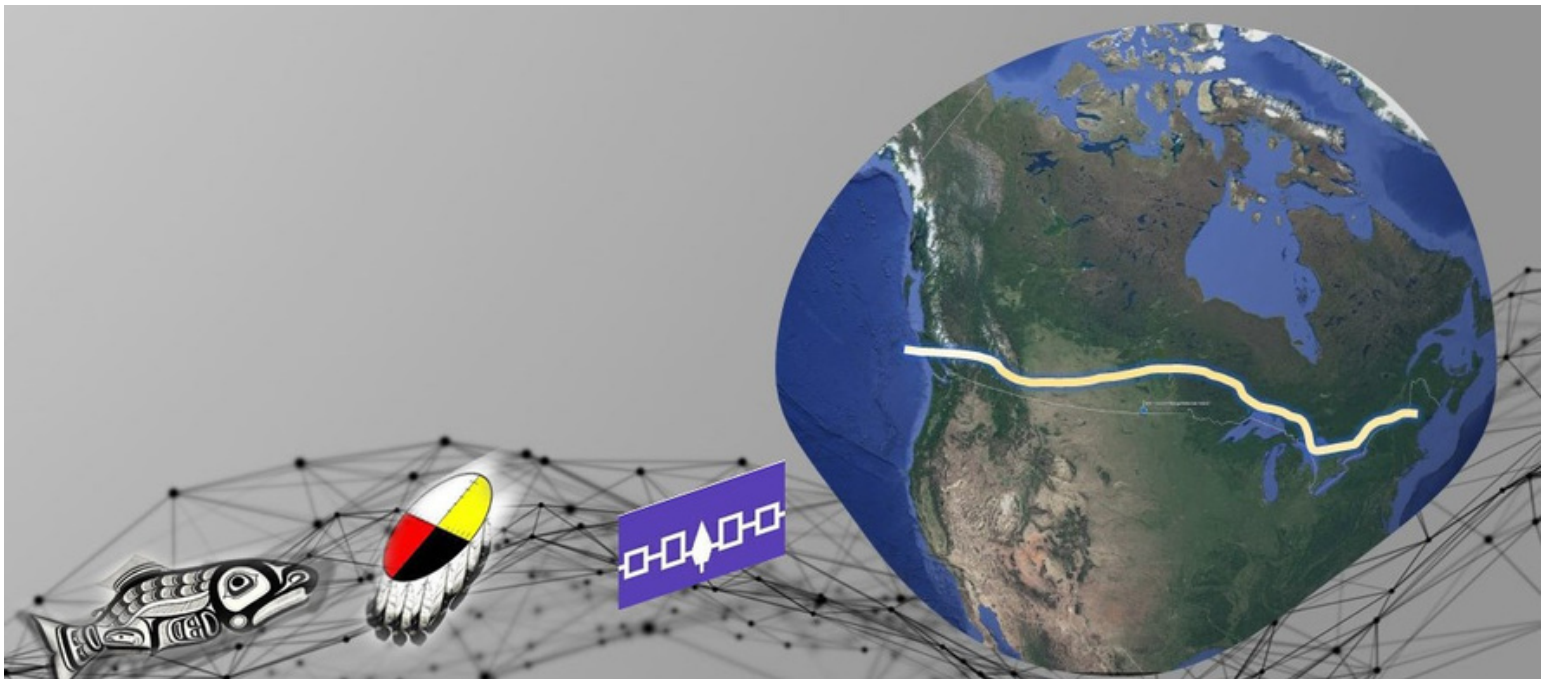


# Decolonizing Across the Medicine Line
